Aristotle, (384 to 322 B.C.), Historia Animalium (Περί ζώων ιστορίας) and Generatione Animalium (Περί ζώων γενέσεως).



Greece today

- Greek economy has experienced an unprecedented crisis during the last five years.
- GDP dropped accumulatively 20% during 2008-2012.
- Public debt estimated at 177% of GDP in 2012.
- General Government deficit around 65,8% in 2012.

Greece today Efforts are paying off

- For the first time in years, Greece recorded a significant primary budgetary surplus of 2,6 billion euros.
- Between 2009 and 2012, the general government deficit shrank by 23.6 bn Euros (or 9.1 % of GDP), and the general government primary deficit shrank by 22.3 bn Euros (or 9.1 % of GDP). Thus Greece achieved an annual rate of fiscal consolidation of 4.4 percentage points of GDP on average, the highest and fastest in the developed world over the last few decades.
- Current Account Deficit shrank by 5.1% GDP between 2008 and 2011. Current Account Deficit fell to 3% GDP in 2012 and is expected to fall to 1.9% GDP in 2013.
- The unit labour cost is reduced significantly below the levels of the Euro-area. Within three years, 2010-12, Greece managed to regain the competitiveness lost during 2000-09.
- Value of exports increased by 32% during 2010-2012 period



When it came to making cogs and gears, the ancient Greeks got there more than a millennium before anyone else, scientists say.







Greece becomes a regional energy hub

Trans Adriatic Pipeline (TAP) for natural gas:

- Azeri natural gas to Western Europe and Balkans through Greece, Albania and Italy.
- Initial annual capacity 10 bcm, expandable to 20 bcm
- 2/3 of TAP will traverse Greek soil.
- Approx. 1,5 bill Euros of investments





Greece becomes a regional energy hub

- •Newly found natural gas deposits in the Eastern Mediterranean.
- •Greece is considered as one of the most interesting gateways for the transport of this gas to the markets of Central and Western Europe, either via pipeline or in the form of LNG.
- Signing of MoU with Cyprus and Israel on energy cooperation.
- •Revithoussa LNG Terminal operating in Greece since 1999, expanded in 2007 and planned to further increase its capacity in the coming years.
- •Encouraging data on natural gas deposits in Eastern Greece, expected to open broader horizons for the local and European Energy scene.



Mining

An activity known to Greeks from Antiquity



Did you know that the construction of the Acropolis was funded by mining proceeds from the Lavrion silver quarries, using the exquisite white marble extracted from Mount Penteli?

- •Greece is the world leading producer of perlite (32% of global output).
- •Also produces 1% of global output of bauxite (largest producer in the EU).
- Other minerals oared in Greece: nickel, silver, gold, zinc.



Greece is considered an all time classic

- 17 million tourists in 2013 (+10% from 2012)
- Estimated 11,5 bill. Euro revenue in 2013
- 18% of GDP

Greek – owned vessels: The Global Carrier.

- Greece has the 7th largest Merchant Marine Fleet in the world, when flag of vessel is considered, and the largest when ship ownership is the criterion.
- Greek ship-owners hold
- 15% of global seaborne carrying capacity
- 24% of world tanker fleet
- 17% of world dry bulk fleet



•Despite the crisis, the tonnage of the Greek Merchant Fleet has grown by more than 2%, during the period 2011-2013, while the average age of the fleet has dropped, making it one of the youngest in the world.

•This is a testimony to the flexibility and adaptability of the Greek seafarers to the sector's fluctuations.

The port of Pireaus is the fastest growing port in the EU.




Greece is the birthplace of the Marathon run.
